Morgan County

RUAG Aerospace USA, Inc. will invest \$30.6 million for a manufacturing facility to supply carbon fiber structures, including payload fairings for the Atlas and new Vulcan rockets. RUAG will utilize 130,000 s/f space inside ULA's plant in Decatur and is scheduled to begin operation by late 2016. The company will hire 100 employees by 2017 and plans to open offices in Huntsville.

Bunge North America announced the company will add three new production lines to their existing packaging facility to produce products not currently made at the Decatur plant. The company will invest \$11.3 million to make improvements to the building's interior and acquire machinery and equipment. Bunge is a major oilseed processor in the United States, providing protein meal for the livestock industry and edible oils for food service companies and food processors. Bunge also exports grains, oilseeds and related by products, mill corn and rice, and invests in biofuels facilities.

Interstate Billing Service, Inc., founded in Decatur in 1984, announced the company will build a new 36,000 s/f facility. The accounts receivable service has clients in more than 40 states. Construction is scheduled to begin in September and completed fall 2016. This new facility, more than doubling their space, will allow the company to continue to grow and expand their presence throughout the U.S.

Madison County

Lockheed Martin, a global aerospace, defense, security and technologies company, located in Huntsville announced the company will consolidate its Command, Control, Battle Management, and Communications (C2BMC) program. C2BMC is the command and control function that enables the Ballistic Missile Defense System (BMDS). It provides the warfighter with the capability to plan, monitor, and manage the defense against ballistic missile threats. The consolidation is expected to be completed by June 2016 and bring 100 jobs.

Limestone Countv

Polaris Industries is on schedule for spring 2016 startup. The \$48 million, 700,000 s/f facility is still on track to begin production in the latter part of the first guarter. The equipment will be installed at different intervals with most of it being in operation by January 2016. The company will employ 1,700 and hiring is underway with the assistance of Alabama Industrial Development Training (AIDT).

Colbert County

Constellium is a manufacturer of aluminum products and dedicated primarily to aerospace, automotive and packing markets in North America. Because carmakers pledge to increase fuel efficiency by 2025, Constellium plans to spend \$750 million between now and 2020. The Ford F150 pickup will add 1,000 pounds of new aluminum sheet to every truck. Constellium will provide 750 million pounds of additional aluminum for the F150.

Madison County

Simulation Technologies, Inc. received the Army's "Phase I Small Business Innovation Research" contract that will fund research for the execution of software logic regardless of screen size. The software will allow warfighters to maintain situational awareness as they transition between mounted and unmounted tactical environments. Following the success of Phase I, the company will use the newly-developed framework to build a prototype application that can be accessed from a workstation, smartphone or any platform in between.
