# **New Companies**

# **DeKalb County**

**G2 Supply,** a general packaging distributor that manufactures customized wooden containers and corrugated products used in export shipping, will locate in the city of Fort Payne and invest \$1,193,440. This will create 7 jobs within the first year.

Mohegan Renewable Energy (MRE) recently invested \$2 million in a manufacturing plant in Crossville, Alabama. The plant will produce wood pellets out of wood waste which will be used for a low cost, renewable heating solution. In addition to their existing facility in Jasper, Tennessee the two plants combined will ship more than 180,000 tons of wood pellets domestically and internationally to major utilities each year. This will create 18-24 jobs for Crossville, Alabama.

# **Limestone County**

Mazda Toyota Manufacturing USA, Inc. (MTMUS), two of the world's most innovative automakers have selected Huntsville, Alabama to establish their new \$1.6 billion automotive manufacturing facility. The plant will be located in the Huntsville city limits of Limestone County at the mega site near Greenbrier Road. Additional surrounding land will bring the site to over 2400 acres. MTMUS will bring 4,000 new jobs to the area with an average salary of \$50,000. A groundbreaking is expected to take place in the fall of 2018.

# **Madison County**

**DC Blox**, a leading provider of interconnected Edge data centers and carrier class network services, will develop a \$13 million Edge data center in Huntsville. The campus will be located near Redstone Arsenal and the Marshall Space Flight Center. The new data center will accommodate clients who must manage and protect confidential unclassified and classified information. This project will create 10 to 12 high-paying tech jobs.

# **Marshall County**

Roy Tech Environs, Inc., a Shanghai, China based plastic recycling company, will move into the former Kennametal building in Grant, Alabama. The company will invest \$1.6 million in updates to the 80,000sf facility and employ 20-50 people within three years. Roy Tech handles recycling of materials like drums, totes, pallets, trays and engineering plastics including polycarbonate, ABS and nylon.

# **Expanding Companies**

# **Cullman County**

Topre America announced the grand opening of a new \$3.2 million 45,000sf distribution facility on February 9, 2018. Governor Kay Ivey attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new facility. During the ceremony Governor Ivey announced the \$80 million Hot Press Line expansion that Topre America would bring to North Alabama. Both projects will bring in a total of 98 new jobs to the Cullman Community.

# **Franklin County**

Road Gear Truck Equipment, LLC announced the expansion and relocation to a new 172,000sf building at the Mike Green Industrial Park on Highway 243 in Russellville. The \$3.5 million capital investment will create 60-130 jobs over a 2 year period.

# **Lauderdale County**

Tarkett, a global flooring manufacturer, will invest \$60 million over the next three years to expand its luxury tile production plants and build a new distribution center in Florence, Alabama. The expansion will create 50 jobs.

# **Newly Awarded AdvantageSite**

The Economic Development Partnership of Alabama has named Fort Payne's Interstate 59 site as an Alabama AdvantageSite. Since the beginning of this EDPA managed program in 2008, 26 projects have located on AdvantageSites across the state, investing more than \$1.1 billion and creating 5,400 new jobs.



# **HudsonAlpha Institute for Biotechnology**

HudsonAlpha Institute for Biotechnology is preleasing lab and office space as it plans for the opening of its 4th building on the biotech campus that fosters new and expanding life sciences companies. Opening an additional 100,000sf late summer 2018, the building will house components of non-profit genomic research, Educational Outreach, informatics, along with for-profit companies expanding and locating within the growing biotech park in Huntsville.
