



Huntsville, AL Earns First Place Rankings

Best Place to Live for Families — US News & World Report

The #1 metro area that meets the most important criteria for families looking to relocate is Huntsville, AL, according to US News & World Report. To help find the right metro area for raising children, U.S. News & World Report started with the Best Places to Live in the U.S. rankings for 2023-2024, then weighted affordability, quality of life, and job market equally. Also taken into consideration is the quality of high school education, average commute time, crime rate, and the area's overall well-being and access to top-notch health care.

In their 2023 Study of Best Job Markets, *SmartAsset* ranked Huntsville, AL #1 out of 340 of the largest U.S. cities. Numerous categories were evaluated including unemployment rate, median income to housing payment ratio, commuting times, percentage of workers who have private health insurance through their employer, and recent income growth. "Huntsville is fairly inexpensive to live in based on average job pay. On average, housing costs make up only 15.9% of the annual median salary... The average commute time is 19.2 minutes, although 21.1% of the workforce here was remote. Just over 82% of workers get health insurance through their jobs, and the median income grew 30% between 2019 and 2021."
