Industry Expansions

DeKalb County

Kudzu Millwork Inc., the manufacturer of All Temp Windows has expanded into their additional 40,000SF facility in Fort Payne with a new vinyl line and automated equipment representing an investment of \$2.2M, creating 15 jobs.

Madison County

Lockheed Martin, opened their new \$18M engineering center in Huntsville. This 122,000SF facility will provide the space needed for 500 employees working to advance national security capabilities and drive innovation to North Alabama.

Raytheon, launches their \$115M expansion project at their Redstone Missile Integration Facility, creating 185 jobs and further solidifying our position as a hub for defense technology.

Toyota Motor Manufacturing Alabama is investing \$282M in another expansion at the Huntsville engine plant, creating 350 jobs. Toyota Alabama currently supplies engines to seven Toyota vehicle plants in North America. The Huntsville-assembled engines power the Corolla, Highlander, RAV4, Sequoia, Sienna, Tacoma, and Tundra, as well as the Corolla Cross, which is assembled at the Mazda Toyota Manufacturing (MTM) plant in Huntsville.

ColorMasters, Inc., a leading company in flexible films and food packaging solutions, has expanded its operations in Albertville with an investment of \$19M, creating 39 jobs.

Tharptown High School, located in Franklin County, is currently the reigning national champions of the American Rocketry Challenge and recently competed on the international stage, winning second place against teams from France, Japan, and the U.K.

New Investment

Limestone County

OMCO Solar, one of the nation's largest manufacturers of steel structures for solar panels, will be investing over \$10M into its second production facility in Alabama, creating 70 jobs. This new facility houses multiple high-speed manufacturing systems designed specifically to produce the Series 7 PV module back-rail for First Solar, the #1 US-based solar module manufacturer, currently completing construction on their \$1.1B solar panel factory also located in North Alabama in Lawrence County.

Shape Corporation, a global tier-1 automotive supplier of structural components, celebrated the grand opening of their second production facility in Limestone County. The additional 202,306SF facility in Southpoint Industrial Park represents an investment of \$74M over the next 5 years, and is expected to create over 100 new jobs.

Madison County

Skyfire Consulting, a drone company formerly headquartered in Atlanta, announced the relocation of their headquarters to the Huntsville International Airport's Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Detection and Mitigation Research Program Test Site.

Recent Development

Muscle Shoals announced their new \$65M mixed-use sports and entertainment complex expected to include indoor (95,000SF) and outdoor sports facilities as well as a 1,000 seat amphitheater adjacent to major retailers.

Updates

In 2023, **Alabama** became the top auto-exporting state in the United States, with exports totaling \$11.2 billion. Honda, Hyundai, Mazda, Mercedes-Benz, and Toyota have each made their home here, along with an ever-expanding network of auto suppliers. Alabama is now in the Top-5 nationally for automotive production states with the capacity to produce 1.3 million vehicles each year.

The Shoals

The Shoals EDA's Remote Shoals Program has been renewed. In June, additional funding was approved, bringing the lifetime incentive funding to \$1,500,000. Since its launch, Remote Shoals has welcomed 134 remote workers into The Shoals, bringing with them over \$13M in annual payroll. All 264 new residents (spouses, partners, children, etc.) give back to the community in many ways. Applications reopen on September 1st.
